All competitors must have points greater than zero on the most current CPL to take part of the Trials. Athletes who are not on the current CPL may request an exemption of the requirement through a written request to the SDD(jbeaulieu@nordiqcanada.ca) / EOM(jgyapay@nordiqcanada.ca) prior to event registration closing. Please refer to the Nordiq Canada Race License Policy.

Skiers must also hold a FIS license to be eligible for the cash purse awarded in the Open categories.

NC and SFQ race licenses are required for **Quebec skiers in the U20 and senior** categories who wish to be eligible for rankings and awards of the Quebec Cup. The SFQ race license is not required for athletes from outside Quebec. However, athletes from other jurisdictions must have their annual license or purchase an NC Tier2 Race Event License when registering.

Racing up is allowed at registration online only on condition that the distance covered by the next category does not exceed the limit allowed for the category by the Nordiq Canada Competition

Model. Athletes racing up must select the minimum year of birth of the new category when registering online. Athletes racing in the Open sprints MUST register in their age of birth.

All U16 and above skiers who are affiliated with a Quebec club must pay an SFQ race fee. For skiers not affiliated with a club, those who reside in Quebec must pay the SFQ fee.

NC license numbers and provincial license of the club for the applicability of the SFQ race fees will be validated following the registration. Corrections will be made directly in the participant's Zone4 registration cart by the race secretary to keep track of changes made. Incorrectly registered racers will be debited or credited directly from the payment platform when applicable.

REGISTRATION CORRECTIONS

REFUNDS

Any refunds will be made at the sole discretion of the Organizing Committee. No registration or supporting member day license fees will be refunded in the event the athlete does not attend one or more races.

If it is forced to cancel the event, the Organizing Committee, in cooperation with Nordiq Canada, will refund the registration fee less the costs incurred for any items that cannot be reused at future events.

SEEDING

The individual sprint competition on Thursday, January 4, 2024 will consist of one category Open (U20+Senior) for these events:

- U20's MUST REGISTER AS A U20. However If a U20 makes top 30 in the qualifier they WILL BE PLACED in the Open category for heats and finals.
- There will be another round of heats and finals for the next best 30 ranked U20s only.

Athletes are to register in their date of birth age categories Heats will be separated into:

- A. Open (1 30) which will be the Top 30 athletes of U20 and Senior age categories
- B. U20 only (31 60) comprised of the next best U20s who did not qualify for the Top 30.
- If a Senior does not qualify in the top 30 Open, they do not carry onto heats.

Final ranking lists for medals, merchandise awards and Competition Trip and National Ski Team (NST) selections will be done from the Open Final rankings then the U20 Final rankings.

On the Saturday races, the U16 category will be grouped with the U18 category.

Refer to section 6.0 of the 2024 Nordiq Canada Selection Trials Technical Package or the Coupe Québec rules regarding the allocation of starting groups.

AWARDS

Medals and prizes will be awarded after the Selection Trials events and at the end of the competition, based on unofficial results.

• Sprint:

- Merchandise for the top 3 international competitors (when applicable)
- o Merchandise for the top six (6) in Open category. Medal for the top three.
- Merchandise for Top U23.
- o Merchandise for Top qualifier.
- Merchandise for the top six (6) U20 with highest ranking U20s in the Open Heats, followed by the next highest ranked athletes in the U20 Heats. Medal for the top three.

• Distance:

- Merchandise for the top 3 international competitors (when applicable)
- Merchandise for top six (6) in Open category. Medal for the top three.
- Merchandise for Top U23.
- Merchandise for the top six (6) U20. Medal for the top three.
- Merchandise for the top five (5) U18, U16. Medal for the top three.

DOPING CONTROL

Participants must be aware that doping control tests may be conducted by the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) on a random basis in accordance with the Canadian Anti-Doping Program. To avoid an inadvertent positive test and the consequences of an anti-doping rule violation, athletes are invited to read Nordiq Canada's <u>anti-doping policy</u>.

OTHER INFORMATION

ACCESS FEES

For skiers, registration fees include access to the trail system during official training days and competitions from January 3rd, 2024, to January 7th, 2024, inclusively. For Quebec Cup skiers, the registration fee includes access to the network from January 5 to January 7, 2024. A trail pass is required outside of these periods.

For coaches, access is free for the duration of the event. Coaches <u>must register on Zone 4</u> so we can create a list of email addresses and a Whatsapp group that will be used to communicate any changes or decisions made during the event.

<u>All skiers and coaches must bring their Zone4 registration receipt</u> as proof to be allowed access to the cross-country ski center. Mont-Sainte-Anne reserves the right to charge an access fee for those who do not have their Zone4 receipt.

Note: Mont-Sainte-Anne will allow free access to spectators who do not use the trail system.

BIB PICK-UP

Bibs can be picked up at the Race Secretary office (Chalet du Fondeur) between 7:30 and 8:30 a.m. on each race day. If both "Club" and "Team" fields are selected on the Zone4 registration form, skiers will be asked to choose whether their bib should be picked up by their club or team at the time of registration. Clubs and teams will be charged a bib replacement fee of \$50 for each missing bib or transponder at the end of each race.

COACHES' BIBS

Nordiq Canada will provide bibs for coaches at this event. The Jury will decide before the start of the competition whether or not to authorize their use. If applicable, coaches' bibs will be distributed by the OC at a maximum of two per club at the time of athlete bibs pick-up.

Coach bibs must be returned to the OC at the end of the event. NC will be entitled to claim \$50 for each bib not returned to the club at fault.

Coach bibs are intended for wax testing on course, only during distance days, in the direction of travel of the course.

TRANSPONDERS

Transponders will be used for sprint qualification and distance races. They will be distributed in the area near the start. Clubs, teams, and training centers will be charged a transponder replacement fee of \$50 for each missing transponder at the end of each race.

WARM-UP & SKI TESTING

A ski test track will be available near the waxing facilities if snow conditions permit. Skiers will be able to proceed to their warm-up in the tracks on the periphery of the competition site when the competition courses are closed. At this point, they will have to share the trails with the customers of the Mont-Sainte-Anne ski resort.

COURSE AND STADIUM MAPS

Courses maps and stadiums layouts will be available by **December 22, 2023,** on the Zone4 event page and on the Facebook page event.

FEEDING

There will be a feed on the course for the Open category during the Sunday race.

There will be energy drink, water, and packed food available on self-serve basis at the finish of every race.

NOTICE BOARDS

All communications will be done electronically but there will be two notice boards on site for general information. One of the notice boards is inside the athletes' chalet. The other one is located at the exit of the stadium.

RESULTS AND PROTESTS

The official timing will be done with Summit Systems timers; the data will be managed by Zone4. Live streaming of results will be provided on Zone4. Unofficial and official results will be posted on Zone4. Protests must be submitted in accordance with ICR 361. Protests according to the art. 361.1.1 – 361.1.5 can be submitted to the secretariat office at xcskimsa.competition@gmail.com. A notification will be sent on the coaches WhatsApp group to indicate that unofficial results can be consulted. The protest period will end 15 minutes after the notification is sent.

WAXING RESTRICTIONS

This event is subject to the Fluoro Wax Rule for Nordiq Canada Sanctioned Races 2023-24.

Fluoro wax is restricted for Canadian FIS Tier 1 events and all other Nordiq Canada sanctioned events. This includes:

- Canada Cups
- Nordig Cups (COC) / Nordig Canada Selection Trials
- Nordiq Canada wax project for Open Category: Mandatory standardized glide wax for open category
- Nordig Canada Ski Nationals
- Tier 2 events (Provincial)

NOT PERMITTED

- Fluoro Kick Wax
- High fluoro (HF), medium fluoro (MF), or low fluoro (LF) glide wax, including HF, MF, or LF powders, pucks, blocks and liquids
- Cold weather powder additives and hardeners
- Fluoro grip powders

Nordiq Canada has set up a pilot project concerning glide wax for the Trials. A technician appointed by NC will provide all clubs, teams and training centers with the mandatory glide wax to be used for two pairs of racing skis for each athlete in the Open category for each race. For training days, clubs must provide glide wax. This protocol applies to the Open category only.

For competition in classic technique, club technicians will be responsible for testing and applying non-fluorinated kick wax.

A waxing protocol document will be made available to coaches prior to the event.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND SERVICES

WAXING FACILITIES

A special waxing protocol is in place for the Nordiq Canada 2024 trials. As such, two 12'x60' open-space trailers divided into 24 areas of 4'x12' have been made available by the OC. A rental cost of \$135 + tax + Zone4 service fee has been determined by NC and the OC for the rental of a 4'x12' area. Clubs are encouraged to arrange among themselves to share space and costs.

According to the established parameters, each 4'x12' space can accommodate a table and meet the needs of 8 athletes.

Here are the specifications to determine your needs:

- Up to 8 athletes = 1 table (2 benches)
- 8 16 athletes = 2 tables (4 benches)
- 16 24 athletes = 3 tables (6 benches)
- 24 athletes and more = 4 tables (8 benches)

All Open category competition skis must be prepared in these common areas. Skis in the U18/U16 categories are not permitted in this waxing area. Tables and benches are not provided by the OC. Clubs must provide their own equipment.

Teams can reserve spaces using the Zone4 <u>2024 Nordiq Canada Selection Trials - Rental Waxing Facilities</u> form **before Sunday, December 10, 2023**. If all 24 spaces have already been allocated, please contact the organization at xcskimsa.info@gmail.com for your requirements.

For the Quebec Cup, parking spaces are provided for teams with their own waxing truck or trailer, and who are self-sufficient in electricity (generator). Teams who do not have their own waxing trailer can reserve a 4'x12' area for waxing the skis of their U18/U16 athletes, at a cost of \$135 + tax + Zone4 service charge. As with the Open category, clubs are encouraged to arrange among themselves to share space and costs. The OC will provide the relevant teams with the reservation procedure. However, these teams must communicate their needs to xcskimsa.info@gmail.com before Sunday, December 10, 2023, indicating:

- Team name, manager, contact details, number of skiers
- Need: Number of waxing places

It should be noted that the OC has provided for the possibility of adding an additional trailer if needed.
